Reminders

When weather gets warmer, please can we remind you to put an ice pack in lunch bags and keep hot food in an insulated container. We must insist that lunches are nut-free and free from anything containing nuts, including sandwiches made with 'Nutella' or peanut butter. In addition, lunches may not include sweets, chocolate, crisps, biscuit packs or drinks. All children will be given water with their packed lunch.
