Reminders

Please do not leave any sweets/snacks in children's backpacks or pockets when they come to the nursery. We provide fruit and fresh water at the nursery and some children have allergies and dietary restrictions.

Please can we remind you to put an ice pack in lunch bags and keep hot food in an insulated container. We must insist that lunches are **nut-free** and free from anything containing **nuts**, including sesame, 'Nutella' and peanut butter. Please make sure they are not in the ingredients of sauces/dips either. Lunches may not include sweets, chocolate, crisps, biscuit packs or sweetened drinks. As the car park is only for the residents of the flats and visitors who have booked a space, we ask that you don't park there otherwise you may get a parking ticket. We kindly ask that you do not double park outside. Please also keep the entrance door closed behind you and children should not ride their scooters/bikes in the building.

Other things to bear in mind regarding collection times are:

If you need to collect your child early, we ask that you arrive prior to 11.20am or 2.50pm so children's group time will be protected as targeted learning time. If you arrive after these times you will be asked to wait until the end of the session. Please ensure that anyone collecting your child is also aware of this arrangement.

In addition, if you are going to be late, please give us a call so we can reassure your child. We would also appreciate that you inform us early and keep us updated if your child is going to be absent.

Measured how tall we are and compared with our friends. We also measured our heads and waists. Some teachers let us measure theirs too!
